Attendance

As you will be aware from previous communications, our aim as a school, is that we have children in school enjoying learning, with an expectation that most children will have an annual attendance figure of around 96—97%. Learning and progress happens when children are happy, healthy and present at school and data clearly indicates the impact poor attendance has on attainment and the future prospects of our children, but also on friendships and self-esteem.

In our last newsletter, I said that I would be recognising classes where there had been an overall improvement in attendance. Current data from across the school can be seen in the grid below. The aim would be that each class aims for improved attendance and a class figure above 95%.

Where the class attendance is at or above 95% it is shown as green. Where there has been an improvement since the last newsletter, it will be shown as blue. It would be lovely if we could aim for every class to be green or blue on the next newsletter!

Parent User Agreements:





As part of safer internet week we worked with children and some parents and all pupils were asked to sign our new acceptable use agreement in school.

Parents in KS1 may already have been asked to counter sign this. Look out for communications next week, where we will be sending home the parent and carer parts of the agreements, in order to support safe and responsible use of technology.

Over the past few weeks it has also become apparent often with changing technologies and trends, it can be hard to keep up with your child's online use and support them effectively. There are lots of useful links on our school website under E safety and well as the free webinar below available to parents.

Cyber Choices is a programme that supports those people at risk of committing computer misuse offences, such as hacking. These risks are far more real than most people recognise, with around 1 in 4 young people admitting to committing low-harm cybercrimes, perhaps without even realising what they were doing was illegal. Ideally suited to parents/carers of children in Year 3 (age 7) and above, all the way up to college, university and beyond. The session will help parents and carers to understand: what computer misuse is what the risks to young people are recognise some of the indicators that young people may be involved in committing cybercrimes how the Cyber Choices programme supports at-risk individuals.

A big thank you to all the staff who accompanied the children enabling them to have such a wonderful trip.










Coming Up.....
