Sadly, I have had to write individually to a number of parents about attendance this academic year. This is a real concern, as we know regular, consistent attendance at school is one of the most important factors in determining a child's academic outcomes and thus their life chances thereafter. Please think carefully before keeping your child home from school and in the event of an absence contact us immediately. We are happy to advise around illness and when it is best to keep a child home, but otherwise we ask that we work together to improve attendance and ensure that every child is in school and therefore receiving the education they are entitled to.

Uniform

With this in mind, please ensure children come to school with an appropriate coat and footwear that keeps their feet both warm and dry.

Parent Forum

- Specific elements of Maths perhaps knowledge organisers and correct methods
- Well being curriculum

IN RESPONSE:

We spoke about the growing Music curriculum under Mrs Gilder's new role and leadership and upcoming opportunities including potential instrument instruction which could be provided by Hampshire if there were uptake.

We have taken on board the other feedback around Maths and well-being and curriculum leads and teachers are thinking about how to enhance communication in these areas.

Discussions also took place about suggestions for future enhancements which included, calming extra-curricular clubs, the use of more visitors to raise awareness and aspirations in certain areas. We have taken these suggestions on board – Watch this space!

Our next topic for discussion will be expectations, outcomes and assessment.
